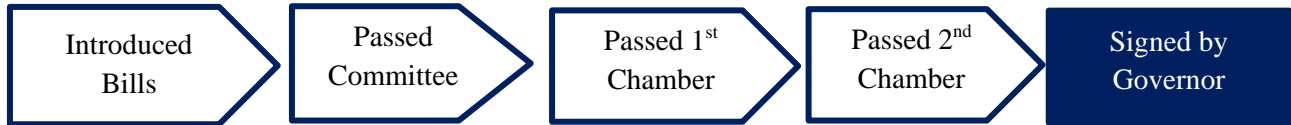


Michigan Healthcare Legislation 2019-2020

SB 106 ELECTRONIC CIGARETTES (Outman)

Prohibits the sale of electronic cigarettes or any device that provides vapor nicotine to minors and requires sellers of liquid nicotine containers to ensure the products meet certain requirements.

SB 128 PRESCRIBER-PATIENT RELATIONSHIP (Hertel, C.)

Revises the definition of bona fide prescriber-patient relationship.

SB 155 LIQUID NICOTINE (Bullock)

Requires sellers of liquid nicotine containers to ensure products meet certain requirements and restricts customer access to certain products.

SB 362 HEALTHY MICHIGAN ([Hertel, C.](#))

Modifies the Healthy Michigan Plan recipients' workforce engagement monthly reporting requirements.

SB 348 MEDICAID POLICY (MacGregor)

Requires a prospective effective date for certain interpretations of existing Medicaid provider policy.

HB 4051 MENTAL HEALTH HOTLINE (Whiteford)

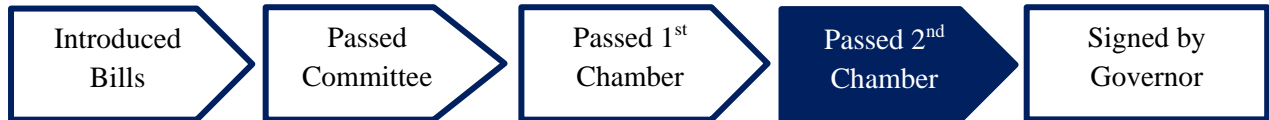
Creates Michigan CARES hotline.

HB 4367 OPIOID ANTAGONISTS (Sheppard)

Allows librarians to administer opioid antagonists under certain circumstances.

Expands definition of peace officer in the carrying and administering of opioid antagonists act to include corrections officers.

[HB 4223](#) CHILD DENTAL SCREENINGS (VanSingel)

Requires dental screenings for children prior to starting kindergarten or first grade.

[HB 4366](#) OPIOID ANTAGONISTS (Sheppard)

Allows pharmacists to prescribe opioid antagonists to libraries under certain circumstances.

[HB 5412](#) TELEMEDICINE SERVICES (Vaupel)

Modifies definition of telemedicine services in the insurance code of 1956.

Introduced (1/28/2020; To Health Policy)

[HB 5413](#) TELEMEDICINE SERVICES (Wozniak)

Modifies definition of telemedicine services in the nonprofit health care corporation reform act.

[HB 5414](#) TELEMEDICINE SERVICES (Green)

Adds definition of telemedicine services in the mental health code.

Introduced (1/28/2020; To Health Policy)

HB 5415 MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENTS (Liberati)

Requires Medicaid reimbursement of remote patient monitoring via telemedicine.

HB 5416 MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENTS (Whiteford)

Provides for medical reimbursement for in-home or in-school telemedicine services.

SB 127 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES (VanderWall)

Provides and exemption for hospice and exempts hospice patients from a bona fide prescriber-patient relationship requirement for prescribing a controlled substance.

SB 248 PRESCRIPTIONS (Johnson, Ruth)

Requires physicians or other licensees who write prescriptions to electronically transmit to a pharmacy under certain circumstances.

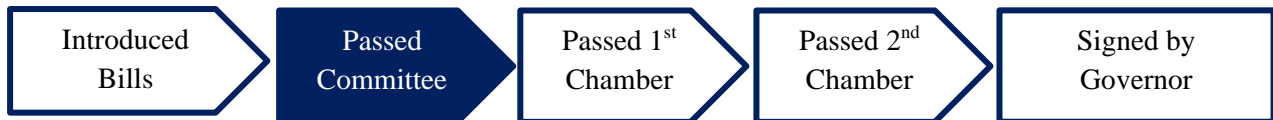
SB 343 HEALTH PROVIDERS (VanderWall)

Modifies the maximum amount of debt or expense repayment under the essential health provider repayment program under certain circumstances.

SB 363 HEALTHY MICHIGAN (Shirkey)

Exempts recipients of the Healthy Michigan program from reporting requirements under certain circumstances.

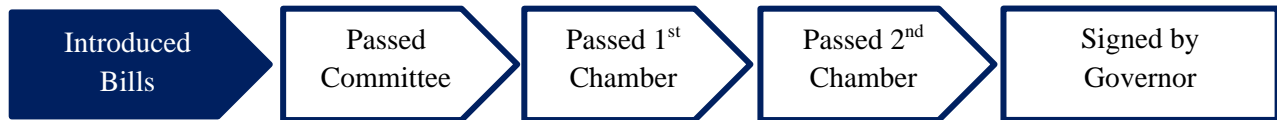

HB 4459 HEALTH PROVIDERS (Hauck) Regulates charges by nonparticipating providers.

HB 4460 HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS (Liberati)

Regulates charges by nonparticipating providers.

Updated in this Section: Introduced Bills**[HB 4039](#) TOBACCO (Brann)**

Prohibits selling, giving or furnishing tobacco products or tobacco paraphernalia to individuals under 21 and repeals prohibition of the purchase, possession or use of tobacco by minors.

[HB 4040](#) CIGARETTE VENDING MACHINES (Sabo)

Prohibits tobacco product vending machines.

[HB 4041](#) TOBACCO DELIVERY (Calley)

Expands prohibition on deliveries and sales of tobacco products and tobacco paraphernalia by mail or vending machines.

[HB 4052](#) PSYCHIATRIC PROGRAMS (Whiteford)

Provides for licensure for adult residential psychiatric programs.

[HB 4057](#) LIQUOR TAX EARMARK (Marino)

Creates earmark of net revenues for substance use disorder prevention & treatment programs.

Introduced (1/17/2019; To Health Policy)

[HB 4076](#) INTERNET CRIMES (Kuppa)

Provides for penalties for coercing vulnerable adults into providing sexually explicit visual material.

Introduced (1/23/2019; To Families, Children and Seniors)

[HB 4154](#) PRESCRIPTION DRUGS (Vaupel)

Requires manufacturers of prescription drugs to file report on costs associated with those drugs under certain circumstances.

Introduced (2/6/2019; To Government Operations)

[HB 4155](#) PHARMACY BENEFITS (Vaupel)

Regulates pharmacy benefit managers.

Introduced (2/6/2019; To Government Operations)

HB 4188 TOBACCO TAX (Hood)

Modifies tax on certain electronic smoking devices and certain tobacco products and earmarks revenue.

Introduced (2/14/2019; To Regulatory Reform)

HB 4345 DRUG OVERDOSE RESPONSE (Garrett)

Requires certain drug overdose training for medical first responders and paramedics.

Introduced (3/13/2019; To Health Policy)

HB 4346 DRUG OVERDOSE RESPONSE (Jones, J.)

Requires drug overdose training for peace officers that corresponds to training program for medical first responders and paramedics.

Introduced (3/13/2019; To Health Policy)

SB 20 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES (Zorn)

Modifies the venue of prosecution for delivery of a controlled substance causing death.

Introduced (1/15/2019; To Judiciary and Public Safety)

SB21 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES (Zorn)

Modifies jurisdiction for the prosecution of delivery of controlled substances causing death.

Introduced (1/15/2019; To Judiciary and Public Safety)

SB 58 CIGARETTE TAX (Runestad)

Modifies cigarette tax.

Introduced (1/23/2019; To Finance)

SB 690 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS (Stamas)

Provides for supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2019-20.

Introduced (12/11/2019; To Appropriations)

SB 897 TASTING ROOMS (LaSata)

Allows under certain conditions for an on-premises tasting room and an off-premises tasting room held at the same location.

Introduced (4/28/2020; To Regulatory Reform)

SB 899 HEALTH PROFESSIONALS (MacDonald)

Provides immunity for certain health care workers from civil or criminal liability during a declared state of emergency.

Introduced (4/29/2020; To Government Operations)

SB 920 PHARMACIES (MacGregor)

Provides for certain enhancements to capacity, flexibility and efficiency for pharmacies during certain emergency declarations.
