Vaccination Requirement

Effective October 1, 2022, MSHO has lifted its requirement of being fully vaccinated to attend MSHO sponsored events.

Masks

In the interest of community health, MSHO recommends attendees wear a high-quality mask while in the meeting room and when in close proximity with colleagues.

Acceptance of Risk Relating to Coronavirus/COVID-19

COVID-19 is a contagious virus that spreads easily through person-to-person contact. Federal and state authorities recommend physical distancing, cleaning your hands regularly, and wearing a mask to mitigate the spread of the virus.

Any situation where individuals come in close contact with one another, such as attending a conference, carries a risk of exposure to COVID-19.

By attending an MSHO in-person event, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure and confirm that you:

- Are not experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19 identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention at [CDC.gov](https://www.cdc.gov), or
- Are not under any self-quarantine order.

If at any time while participating in an MSHO event you experience symptoms or otherwise feel ill, please do not attend any further sessions, inform an MSHO team member, then leave immediately.
