

Michigan Legislation 2021-2022

HB 4348 Pharmacy Benefit Managers (Calley)

Provides for requirement for pharmacy benefit managers to be licensed in Michigan. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee) Signed by the Governor (2/23/2022; Signed: February 23, 2022, Effective: January 1, 2024)

HB 4351 Pharmacy Benefit Managers (Whitsett)

Provides for provide for definition and regulation of a pharmacy benefit manager and regulates certain actions by a carrier relating to prescriptions drugs. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee) Signed by the Governor (2/23/2022; Signed: February 23, 2022, Effective: February 23, 2022)

HB 4352 Prescription Drug Prices (Allor)

Allows disclosure of prescription drug prices to consumers and prohibits pharmacies and pharmacists from entering into certain contracts. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee) Signed by the Governor (2/23/2022; Signed: February 23, 2022, Effective: February 23, 2022)

SB 247 Health Insurance (VanderWall)

Provides preauthorization's conducted by utilization review entities related to health care services. Introduced (3/16/2021; To Health Policy and Human Services Committee) Signed by the Governor (4/7/2022; Signed: April 7, 2022, Effective: April 7, 2022)

SB 412 Prescription Drugs (Hertel, C.)

Provides exemption of certain prescription drugs from the department of health and human services Medicaid prior authorization process. Introduced (5/4/2021; To Health Policy and Human Services Committee) Signed by the Governor (3/10/2022; Signed: March 10, 2022, Effective: June 7, 2022)

SB 576 Tobacco (Zorn)

Modifies age of penal code provisions for selling or distributing tobacco products by mail or vending machines. Introduced (6/24/2021; To Regulatory Reform Committee) Signed by the Governor (7/21/2022; Signed: July 21, 2022, Effective: July 21, 2022)

SB 577 Tobacco (Wojno)

Modifies age of majority act. Introduced (6/24/2021; To Regulatory Reform Committee) Signed by the Governor (7/21/2022; Signed: July 21, 2022, Effective: July 21, 2022)

SB 720 Tobacco Products Tax (Runestad)

Modifies tobacco products tax act. Introduced (11/3/2021; To Finance Committee) Signed by the Governor (7/21/2022; Signed: July 21, 2022, Effective: July 21, 2022)

SB 721 Tobacco Products Tax (Runestad)

Updates references in the health and safety fund act to the tobacco products tax act. Introduced (11/3/2021; To Finance Committee) Signed by the Governor (7/21/2022; Signed: July 21, 2022, Effective: July 21, 2022)



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HB 4347 Prescription Drugs (Witwer)

Requires reports on certain costs and other information associated with prescription drugs and requires manufacturers of prescription drugs to file with the department. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 4349 Hospital Charges (Berman)

Requires hospitals to make available to the public pursuant to federal law list of standard charges for certain items and services. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 4350 Prescription Drugs (Young)

Modifies exemption from criminal liability to exclude manufacturers of prescription drugs from providing discounts under certain circumstances. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 4353 Prescription Drugs (Kahle)

Requires application of amount paid by the insured or other certain parties when calculating the insured's co-pay for a prescription drug under certain conditions. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 4354 Oral Chemotherapy (Rendon)

Provides equal treatment for coverage for orally administered anticancer chemotherapy. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Insurance Committee)

HB 4355 Telehealth (Brann)

Allows out-of-state health professionals to provide telehealth services to Michigan residents. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 4357 Drug Manufacturers (Roth)

Prohibits distribution of gifts or other inducements by drug manufacturers or wholesale distributors to a health care provider and requires drug manufacturers and wholesale distributors to provide certain information to the board of pharmacy. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 4358 Health Insurance Changes (Hammoud)

Regulates formulary changes during a plan year. Introduced (2/24/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 4878 Tobacco (Lilly)

Prohibits sale of synthetic or tobacco free nicotine to an individual under 21 and requires the product packaging to include a disclosure that the product is not regulated by the FDA. Introduced (5/19/2021; To Rules & Competitiveness Committee)

HB 5334 License Plate (Hauck)

Creates fund-raising plates for prostate cancer awareness. Introduced (9/23/2021; To Transportation Committee)

HB 5637 Right To Try Act (Whiteford)

Modifies right to try act to include certain drugs and treatments during a COVID-19 pandemic emergency. Introduced (12/14/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

SB 257 Health Orders (MacDonald)

Provides limitations on certain gatherings in emergency orders in response to an epidemic. Introduced (3/18/2021; To Government Operations Committee)



SB 1135 Telemedicine (MacDonald)

Provides definition of distant site for a telemedicine visit. Introduced (6/30/2022; To Health Policy and Human Services Committee)



HB 4028 Physician Certification (Hoitenga)

Prohibits insurer requiring physicians to hold certain certifications before paying or reimbursing claims unless specifically required for licensure. Introduced (1/27/2021; To Insurance Committee)

HB 4114 Tobacco (Hall)

Modifies cigarette tax. Introduced (2/3/2021; To Tax Policy Committee)

HB 5006 Pharmacy Benefit Managers (Hammoud)

Prohibits Medicaid contract with pharmacy benefit management under certain circumstances. Introduced (6/15/2021; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 5966 Micare Act (Rabhi)

Creates Micare act. Introduced (3/23/2022; To Health Policy Committee)

HB 6112 MIHealth Marketplace (Tisdell)

Provides state-based insurance exchange. Introduced (5/18/2022; To Health Policy Committee)

SB 224 Sexual Assault (Lauwers)

Prohibits sexual contact and sexual penetration under pretext of medical treatment and provide penalties. Introduced (3/10/2021; To Judiciary and Public Safety Committee)

SB 225 Criminal Procedure (Geiss)

Modifies the sentencing guidelines for sexual contact or sexual penetration under pretext of medical treatment. Introduced (3/10/2021; To Judiciary and Public Safety Committee)

SB 226 Health Professionals (Theis)

Requires, under certain circumstances, an additional individual present during certain examinations of minors and requires consent. Introduced (3/10/2021; To Judiciary and Public Safety Committee)

SB 227 Health Professionals (Johnson, R.)

Enacts sentencing guidelines for the crime of performing certain medical treatments on a minor without consent and another individual present. Introduced (3/10/2021; To Judiciary and Public Safety Committee)

SB 404 Medical Facility Policies (Theis)

Prohibits medical providers implementing policies that prohibit certain persons from being present with minors or developmentally disabled individuals during medical procedures except under certain circumstances. Introduced (4/29/2021; To Health Policy and Human Services Committee)

SB 572 Electronic Smoking Devices (Ananich)

Provides excise tax on certain electronic smoking devices. Introduced (6/24/2021; To Regulatory Reform Committee)

SB 573 Vapor Products (Outman, R.)

Provides prohibition of certain marketing and advertising strategies in the sale of vapor products. Introduced (6/24/2021; To Regulatory Reform Committee)

SB 574 Tobacco (Theis)

Provides compliance checks for the sale of tobacco products, vapor products, or alternative nicotine products to minors and prescribes penalties. Introduced (6/24/2021; To Regulatory Reform Committee)

SB 575 Tobacco (Bullock)

Provides licensing of persons that manufacture and persons that sell tobacco products, vapor products, or alternative nicotine products. Introduced (6/24/2021; To Regulatory Reform Committee)

SB 707 Telehealth Visits (Hollier)

Requires reimbursement rate for telehealth visits to be the same as reimbursements for office visits. Introduced (10/28/2021; To Health Policy and Human Services Committee)
